The three-day gathering – called Education Leadership: An Agenda for School Improvement – was a culmination of sorts, an event marking the foundation's decade-long effort to get policymakers and others to recognize the centrality of principals to school reform.

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To foster school improvement effective leaders nurture and support their staffs and hire carefully. They rely on campus statistics and supporting evidence to identify problems, to understand cause and effect, and to provide sound solutions. Effective leaders walk through classrooms on a regular basis often spending less than 10 minutes observing.
